# PRESIDENT'S REPORT

2016 was a year of significant progress and improvement for Basketball ACT. Some of the highlights include the construction of the 3x3 courts on the north side of the Belconnen stadium, improved participation numbers, and improved performance of our representative and elite teams.



However, perhaps the most important measure of our improvement at the strategic level is financial. Building on a positive trend of recent years, we have finished the 30 September 2016 financial year with a surplus of nearly \$53,000. This is the first profit in many years, and provides a stable base for further improvements and growth in coming years.

A lot of the credit for 2016's performance goes to Maxwell Gratton, who led Basketball ACT as CEO for just over two years. For family and career reasons, Maxwell has moved back to his home town of Melbourne to be the CEO of Football Federation Victoria. Our loss is soccer's gain, and we wish Maxwell all the best in his new role. To find Maxwell's replacement as CEO of Basketball ACT, we advertised nationally, and received 35 applications, including quite a few from overseas and interstate. After a comprehensive evaluation process, we are delighted to announce the appointment of Michael Haynes as our new CEO. Michael brings strengths in business management, stakeholder engagement, and has a wealth of relevant experience. He was the CEO of NSW Northern Suburbs Basketball Association, which has 5,500 players and a budget of nearly \$3M. Michael also brings qualifications in economics and law, and experience working with BA and FIBA. We welcome Michael as our new CEO in mid-March.

Over the past year, the Board has extended invitations to all club Presidents to attend a Board meeting to let us know the successes, issues, and challenges at their club, plus meet the Board members and find out more about what we do. This has proved to be very useful, and we are keen to maintain this open communication with the clubs in 2017.

I would like to thank the current Board – Vice-President Kate Corkery, Treasurer Jocelyn Martin, Gary Pettigrove, Jon Cooper, and Kath Toohey, as well as Debbie Cook who served during the year. As I mentioned last year, like many of you, the Board are unpaid volunteers, and they provide their time and expertise for the good of the sport and the community. I'd also like to thank all of the members, players, coaches, managers, scorers, referees and officials, club presidents/school representatives and their committees, and everyone else who volunteers their time to help out.

I'm really excited about 2017. We have a great platform to build on for further improvements with the organisation.

# TREASURER'S REPORT

For the period ended 30 September 2016, Basketball ACT reported a Total Income of \$2,919,812 (2015 - \$2,637,427) and an overall operating surplus of \$52,990 (2015 Deficit of \$288,180). Total Expenses were \$2,866,822 (2015 Expenses of \$2,919,606).



The 10.7% increase in Income and the 5.7% decrease in Expenses were noted by MCS Audit citing the increase in Elite and Development Income and a reduction in Administration Expenses as contributing factors. Competition Revenue remained the significant component of Revenue contributing \$2 million of Total Income.

It is pleasing to see a return to surplus for Basketball ACT and the Auditors noted a very good improvement in results compared to 2015. The Net Assets for Basketball ACT as at 30 September 2016 were \$4,075,887. The Balance Sheet continues to show a stable position anchored by the Belconnen Facility however a revaluation during the year led to the stadium being revalued down by approximately \$950,000. This in turn will see a more realistic, positive impact through Depreciation. The cash position for the period ended 30 September showed an increase of \$283,071 and the Cash Balance at year end was \$421,607.

Throughout 2016 the Management and Board of Basketball ACT focussed on maintaining the financial discipline developed during 2015. There was a sustained effort to reduce Accounts Receivable and Payables and tighter payment policies were introduced. In addition, Management and the Board developed more robust, regular reporting against budgets. Whilst the Board are pleased with the result and the progress made to date, we made the decision during 2016 to retain MCS Audit to undertake quarterly desktop audits of Basketball ACT's Financial operations. This exercise was only to satisfy the Board that measures introduced continued to be embedded and It should be noted that to date no matters of concern have been raised.

The result for 2016 continued to include an outstanding commitment to the ATO incurred in previous periods. This will be fully paid during 2017 allowing BACT to plan for a surplus again as well as commit just under \$1 million in Capital expenditure an amount which includes the 3x3 development

It is important to recognise the work of Basketball ACT staff who have implemented and maintained significant improvements to financial controls and processes this year, in particular Maxwell Gratton, Dan Jackson and Simone Davies-Brown.

# COMPETITIONS COMMITTEE

The Competitions Committee has seen some major changes throughout the year, with Michael Grubinger departing as Head of Competitions in August and Debbie Cook taking over after a successful stint on the BACT board.



## **Purpose:**

Basketball ACT has established a Competitions Committee to provide strategic advice and support to the BACT Board and CEO with regard to developing and establishing guiding principles, competition rules, policies, guidelines and procedures for competitions conducted by the organisation. The Committee will also ensure appropriate and relevant communication with stakeholders on prospective changes to the above guiding principles, competition rules, policies, quidelines and procedures before they are recommended to the BACT Board for approval.

The committee has met regularly throughout the year and had some robust and constructive discussions about the direction our competitions should take into the future.

With a focus on development this year, the committee has directed its energy to the recruitment, retention and development of referees. Several referee courses were conducted at varying levels throughout the year and a development plan for Southern Junior League competitions that includes pathways and defined selection criteria has been published. These activities, along with increased supervision of junior referees by those in a redefined supervisor role have led to a significant increase in coverage across competitions.

The committee has continued to work towards finalisation of the Club Structure Document, which will be implemented prior to the 2018 Winter season. Engagement with clubs will continue over the next 12 month to assist in meeting the requirements. Most recently, sponsorship was gained for the Canberra Classic and participation increased from 20 teams in 2016 to 35 in 2017. This included the reintroduction of the Womens Invitational division after not seeing any Womens teams competing for the last 3 years.

These are just a few of the initiatives developed and delivered by the Competitions Committee this. I'd like to thank the volunteers on the committee for the time and effort they have given and the real benefit we've seen from their work. The team has worked tirelessly over the past year to ensure the basketball community on the ACT has the highest quality refereeing, coaching and competitions possible and I'm looking forward to seeing even more progress over the next 12 months.

# REFEREES AND OFFICIALS REPORT

I'm pleased to report that we have had another busy and successful year in the Referee's and Officials Department. Our focus firmly remains on referee recruitment and education with three Level 0 referee courses successfully conducted last year with over 130 participants taking part.

This continues our referee growth strategy that we commenced last year and the fruits of our labour are now starting to show. We have record coverage on our junior competitions and moderate increases on our senior competitions.

What is most pleasing throughout this whole process is the depth and quality improvements that we now find ourselves with on our junior competitions. This in turn over the next 12 to 24 months will place us in an even stronger position to increase our coverage and service levels on our senior competitions as appropriately skilled and selected officials are provided further development opportunities.

Once again this year, Basketball ACT conducted a Referee Action Day prior to the commencement of the Summer Junior season, which was well attended. Topics covered on the day included Mechanics, Calling the Game, Player/Coach communication along with a fitness testing session. We are also currently in the final stages of development is the 2017-2019 Referee Development and Action Plan which, once completed and ratified by the Basketball ACT Board, will be distributed to all member clubs and schools. This document will serve to place the Referee's Department in an even stronger position to serve the growing Basketball ACT competitions into the future.

This past twelve months has also seen an increase in the number of referee coaches appointed to assist with the development of Basketball ACT officials. The referee coaches will continue to undergo different types of training that will assist them in delivering a high quality service to members and assist with the ongoing development of officials in the ACT junior competitions.

Basketball ACT continues to work with other state basketball bodies to provide development opportunities of our talented and identified officials and this past 12 months have seen a number of interstate



tournaments and events attended by ACT referees, including:

- BNSW Southern Junior League
- BNSW Country Premier League
- BNSW Waratah League
- BNSW Country Junior Tournament
- Basketball Queensland U18
  State Championships
- BVIC Southern Cross Challenge

Basketball ACT still continues to have strong representation on the Basketball Australia competitions and events including WNBL, SEABL and Australian Junior Championships (AJC), with the following notable achievements throughout the past year:

- Simon Cosier –promotion to WNBL Panel 2, appointed to the SEABL Finals panel
- Jack Taylor appointed to his first SEABL Finals panel
- Michelle Cosier Bronze Medal game U18 AJC
- Mitchell Hudson Gold Medal ASC Championship

I'd like to take this opportunity to thank all members, clubs and schools for their ongoing support for our referees. Without your support we certainly wouldn't be able to make the improvements we have made over the past 18 months. I realise we still have more work to do to continue down the path to where we need to be, but I strongly believe we are on the right track.

# HIGH PERFORMANCE PATHWAYS COMMITTEE

The High Performance and Pathways program was very active this year. The HP Committee consisted of Phil Brown (Convener), Michelle Hocking, Barry Barnes, Debbie Cook (Board Director Resigned), and Gary Pettigrove (Board Director). The objective of the program is around the program stability in regards to player development programs and the development of coaches through education and mentoring.

#### **Coach Reviews Conducted**

The HP Committee completed Head Coach & Program reviews for all junior Development (U12 & U14 Boys & Girls), State Representative (U16 through U20 Men & Women) and Gunners, Gunners Academy, Capitals Academy and IB men's senior Programs. Vacant Head Coach Positions were advertised calling for EOI's and appropriate recruitment process undertaken to fill roles. The assistant & development Coaches in addition to Program Managers across all positions were filled.

The Coaching numbers in HP programs increased by approximately 20% from 2015.

#### **HP** Team Highlights

The **Gunners Academy** reaching preliminary final in NSW Waratah Men's State League and Head Coach Tony Plunkett being named Coach of the Year.

The **U14 Girls Canberra Development Team** reaching 5th place at U14 National Club Championships, the best placing ever by a Canberra Team in the U14 age group.

**The Canberra U14 Boys** reaching Top 12 (from 24 teams) becoming one of the best results by a Canberra team at this age group.

The ACT U18 Women's State Team placing 7th (from 13 teams) at U18 Australian Championships equaling 2nd best result ever at this level by an ACT U18 Women's Team.

# Key Achievements of the HP Program

The introduction of the **FUTURES** development program supporting junior boys and girls in the 11 to 14 years of age has significantly strengthened BACT HP Pathway.

Another significant achievement was the expansion of National Intensive Training Program (NITP) to include additional athletes to better support talented young players in the U16 & U18 State Squads.

The re-emergence of IB Women's Program after a number of year's hiatus. The ACT IB Women's Team will compete at IB National Championships in 2017.

The negotiations with BNSW have resulted in ACT junior teams being re-accepted back into CPL in 2017.

#### **Key Initiatives**

A key initiative was the development of a collaboration agreement with ACT Academy of Sport following the withdrawal of national support by Basketball Australia for all States and Territories' high performance programs. BACT Head of HP was able to establish three ACTAS Individual Athlete Program (IAP) Scholarships in addition to a commercial agreement for athletic development to support 15 ACT National Performance Program (NPP) athletes across male and females. The three IAP scholarships were awarded to Tim Markcrow (wheelchair), Callie Bourne and Isabelle Bourne. In August 2016 BA funding restarted support for the state BACT HP programs to continue.

A significant achievement by BACT HP programs was Isabelle Bourne being awarded a full scholarship by Basketball Australia to attend the Centre of Excellence program at the Australian Institute of Sport at the AIS from 2017.

The NPP had another successful year with weekly group skill development sessions throughout all four school terms in addition to squad mini-camps through August to December. National Coaches including Adam Caporn, Paul Goriss in addition to Canberra SEABL Coaches conducted camp sessions to assist in strengthening links between Basketball Australia National Program and BACT high performance programs.

## **Coaching Education**

Formal and informal coach education programs continued to be expanded throughout 2016 including two 'Club Coach' (Level One) Courses and for the first time in many years the 'Association Coach (Level Two) Course were presented by ACT based coaches. Over 50 Club coaches undertook formal coaching courses in 2016. A number of coaching clinics were presented to Clubs throughout the year. A 'Skills Matrix' was developed to assist coaches and Club Coaching Coordinators with the development of their club curriculum. Professional developmentopportunities were provided to two ACT junior Head Coaches, Paula Jansen and Shane Wallace, to be part-time assistant coaches at the Basketball Australia Centre of Excellence women's program for a number of months through the SEABL season to support interim Head Coach Mel Downer

## **Diversity Program**

The HP Committee conducted a 'Women's HP program' workshop in June to discuss challenges and possible strategies to improve the high performance women's pathway and better support talented young women within the ACT. Primary focus areas were the retention of young women within the HP programs and strengthening the links between the U18 / U20 Representative programs and the Canberra Capitals Academy SEABL program. Also in consideration is a return to BNSW Women's State League to underpin the SEABL program and provide a smoother transition for talented players from juniors to senior SEABL program.

## **Board Support**

The Head of the HP program continued to support and provide

direction to the BACT Executive, Board and Finance Team with the development and updating of HP finance policies and procedures to ensure full compliance. This has included the development of the HP calendar including invoicing processes, dates and streamlining of HP admin support to development and State representative programs.

## Key challenges in the HP area

The development of a BACT Board endorsed **HP Strategic Plan** to improve HP athlete programs.

The shortage (numbers) of Head Coaches with the necessary capability, experience, knowledge and willingness to be Head Coaches within BACT HP programs; particularly at the higher age groups including senior SEABL programs is a concern that needs to be addressed. This could be achieved possibly through an employed coach development professional for the pathway program for coaches from Club level to SEABL.

The development of **SEABL** programs objectives and increasing investments of additional player and management resources to increase professionalism.

Development of strategies to **better support, reward and retain volunteer coaches, managers** and their families within HP programs.

Additional administrative support for the Head of HP is required so the focus is on the program and not the administration tasks.

A significant challenge is around securing suitable courts to meet HP program training requirements.

There is a significant and ongoing challenges around **retention of female athletes in our HP programs.** This is magnified by the emergence of Women's AFL, Women's Cricket, Netball, Soccer and potentially Rugby 7's.


